

- The largest agriculture related manufacturing establishments in District 2 are furniture & related products (50), wood products (37), food (37), textiles (36), apparel (16), and paper (15).



- The largest agriculture related employment manufacturers are food, paper, apparel, wood products, textiles, and furniture & related products.

- The District is home to over 5,280 farms covering more than 473,000 acres. Crop acres are close to 226,000.



- The top five crops in District 2 include hay (121,200 acres), soybeans (11,000 acres), corn for grain (5,000 acres), wheat (3,900 acres), and tobacco (480 acres).



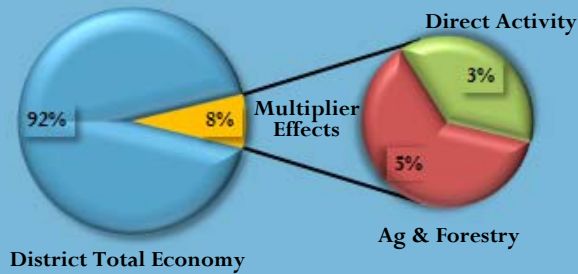
- There are close to 75,000 beef cattle in District 4 with 12,000 milk cows. In addition, there are 870 head of hogs and over 8.6 million broilers.



- Forestland totals 812 thousand acres of which 513 thousand acres are in private ownership.

- The market value of agricultural products sold totals close to \$169 million.
- Over \$1 out of every \$12 in the economy is directly or indirectly derived from agriculture and forestry related industries.
- 1 out of every 18 jobs is directly or indirectly derived from agriculture and forestry related industries.

*Direct effects are the economic impacts due to industry activity. Total effects also include impacts due to supplying industries and the impact effects household incomes have on the economy. Tennessee's Congressional Districts contain partial counties but the model used to estimate the economic impacts, IMPLAN, is modeled on a county basis. Consequently, double counting may occur when comparing the economic impacts of one District to another or trying to sum to statewide values.
